We estimate that you will need approximately £7500 per academic year excluding tuition fees depending upon personal lifestyle and spending habits.

**IMPORTANT:** In order to successfully apply for a visa you must be able to provide financial evidence which shows that you have the full tuition fee for your first year of study PLUS £600 per month maintenance funds (a minimum of £5,400 per academic year) including accommodation fees. This amount must have been in your bank account for a minimum of 28 days prior to your visa application in accordance with the UK Border Agency Tier 4 immigration rules.
