Entry Requirements

You should have keen interest in The Public Services and achieved a minimum 2 GCSE at grade 2 or above.

English and/or Maths will be included in your timetable if you have not achieved a GCSE at grade 4 or above in these subjects when you start your course.

Work Experience

30 hours of relevant experience of work are included in the course. We will be visiting such places as Fire stations, Riot training with the police and a week away with the Army trip. Residential and guest speakers are also used to help enrich your learning experience. Our students work in partnership with the National Citizens Service (NCS) programme which helps to develop key employment skills and behaviours needed for progression to work.

Progression

Successful completion of the Public Services course can help you embark on a career in a Public and Uniformed Services related area. You will be able to progress to further learning, an apprenticeship or employment. You also have the option for progression to the Certificate.
