All units within our Access courses are compulsory.

Entry Requirements

- Entry to this course requires GCSE English Language, Maths and Science at a grade 4 or C. Dependent upon your progression route, level 2 qualifications may be accepted.
- You are at least 19 years old on 1st September.
- You must make sure your Maths and English qualifications are accepted for the degree course you want to progress onto after completing the Access Diploma.
- Some universities may accept 12 credits of science from the Access to HE course as an alternative to a GCSE in science. In these cases, we would have a conversation with the student to check whether your chosen degree allows this substitution. It is the students responsibility to check the GCSE requirements of their chosen university.

Progression

This qualification is well established and widely accepted by universities. Successful completion of this diploma can lead to degree-level study in areas such as:

- Operating Department Practice
- Physiotherapy
- Occupational Therapy
- Paramedic Science
- Radiography
- Other health and life science degrees
