Course Summary

What You Will Learn

You will develop your own sustained, innovate and reflective art and design practice. You will also build upon your critical thinking, evaluation and analysis skills as well as your research capabilities, to enhance the ability to communicate ideas visually and verbally.

Modules

Year 1 (Level 4):

- Techniques and Processes 1 Explore both graphic design and photography in hands-on workshops. You'll acquire essential technical skills in industry-standard software and camera equipment, while developing an eye for composition and visual storytelling. You will experiment with various design elements, typography, and image manipulation techniques, as well as photographic processes including lighting, framing, and post-production. The module includes both digital and traditional methods.
- **Studio Practice 1** Experiment with various Fine Art and Design techniques, challenge conventional limits and cultivate unique creative methods. You will acquire diverse skills, generate concepts in the studio, and settle into the academic setting. Your artistic development is nurtured through one-on-one guidance, workshop orientations, collaboration with peers, project briefings, and presentations by visiting artists.
- **Professional Development for the Creative Industries 1** Preparing you to thrive in professional settings as an artist. You'll have trips to museums, galleries, talks, design shows and exhibitions.
- Critical Studies 1 develop your investigation and analysis skills of key artists, designers and art and design movements

Year 2 (Level 5): Further development of skills and developments of the above:

- Techniques and Processes 2
- Studio Practice 2
- Professional Practice Critical Studies 2

Year 3 (Level 6):

• A project in the final year will solidify all your learning through a body of work which will form part of the Bradford School of Art Summer Show.

Entry Requirements

Admissions criteria 80 UCAS tariff points or equivalent from:

- A BTEC or UAL Level 3 qualification in Art & Design or related Art Practice.
- T Level qualifications are accepted, a T Level PASS with a minimum of a grade A*-C (equates to 96 UCAS points).
- A GCE Advanced Level profile that demonstrates strong performance in a relevant subject or adequate performance in more than one GCE subject. This profile is likely to be supported by GCSE grades at A* to C (9-4) (or equivalent) with GCSE Maths (grade C or above) and English (grade C or above).
- Other related Level 3 qualifications
- An Access to Higher Education Diploma awarded by an approved institution or provider
- Related work experience
- An international equivalent of the above.

Work Experience

Although this course does not directly offer work experience, there are opportunities for you to undertake a work placement or work experience during your time studying on this course.
