Course Summary

Our Entry Level course in Construction Multi Skills introduces you to the essential practical abilities and knowledge required to begin your journey into the construction industry. The programme focuses on hands-on learning across four core trades—plumbing, electrical, bricklaying, and carpentry & joinery while maintaining a strong emphasis on health and safety and recognised industry standards within each discipline.

This course includes project-based learning that embeds GCSE Maths and GCSE English directly into theoretical and practical, vocational tasks through a contextualised model. This ensures learners develop relevant, essential and applied skills that align with the expectations of the construction industry and support their long-term progression.

What You Will Learn

You will learn about the importance of health and safety in the construction industry, how to minimise the risk of accidents caused by hazards and the types of construction

methods used in construction including sustainability. You will also learn the types of activities and job opportunities and set up/maintain a clean and safe working environment.

Like a trainee working on real domestic projects, you will develop an understanding of basic construction principles and learn how to identify, select, and safely use common tools and materials from each trade area. You will practise fundamental tasks such as assembling simple plumbing components, installing basic electrical circuits, constructing small brickwork structures, and producing straightforward carpentry and joinery pieces.

- Installing basic electrical circuits
- Constructing small brickwork structures
- Basic carpentry and joinery techniques

Entry Requirements

Applicants must have GCSE Maths and GCSE English Language at a grade 1 as a minimum or equivalent.

Work Experience

You will undertake at least two meaningful encounters with employers, giving you a genuine introduction to the world of work. Throughout the course, you will partake in workplace visits, industry insight events, employer talks and practical workshops, all designed to build your communication, problem-solving and teamwork skills. You will also undertake focused employability activities, including CV writing, job applications and interview skills.

Progression

Successful completion of this course can lead to progression onto a course of your chosen discipline including Bricklaying, Carpentry & Joinery, Plumbing and Electrical Installation, as well as opportunities for employment or an apprenticeship.
