### **Options available**

There are 3 main options available to your child:

- 1. College course (Bradford College or other colleges)
- 2. Apprenticeships
- 3. Higher Education (University)
- 4. Employment



### College courses

There are a wide range of college courses available for your child. College courses have different levels and entry qualifications.

It is important that you check entry requirements for each course your child is interested in on college websites.



#### **Qualification / educational routes**

### Level 3 courses

- T Levels
- A Levels
- BTEC National Diplomas/ BTEC Extended Diplomas
- Other Level 3 technical qualifications

**Entry Requirements:** Usually 5 GCSEs grades 4-9s in Maths and English

**Next steps:** After doing a Level 3 course you can go to university, do a higher level apprenticeship or go into full time employment





- T Levels are a new 2 year Level 3 qualification for 16-19 year olds (equivalent to A Levels)
- Focus on vocational learning
- 80% is classroom based and 20% is work placement

### Level 2 courses

- GCSEs
- BTEC First Diplomas
- Level 2 certificate/Diploma

**Entry Requirements:** Usually GCSE Grade 2 in Maths and English

**Next steps:** After doing a Level 2 course you can progress onto a Level 3 course, do an apprenticeship or go into full time employment (if you are over 18)



### Level 1 and Entry Level courses

• Entry Level and Level 1 courses are suitable for those with no GCSE grades. These courses will help you to gain a vocational qualification while you work on your maths and English.



# Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships are jobs where you gain qualifications while you work and earn money.

- A great way to <u>EARN</u> whilst you <u>LEARN</u>
- For anyone 16 or over
- Work alongside experienced staff
- Training and skills that employers want and need
- Get time for study related to your role (usually one day a week)
- Entry requirements vary depending on occupation and level of apprenticeship.
- Apprenticeships take 1 to 6 years to complete depending on their level.

When your child is over 18 they are able to get employment.

If your child is looking to get a job after they finish college, we recommend speaking to your child about the transition from education to work, speak to them about the commitments of a full time job including being punctual, reliable, willing to learn new skills on the job.



To prepare for work we recommend:

- Careers guidance interview to help you decide what type of job or industry you would like
- CV to help your child to apply for jobs
- Interview skills

The careers team can help you write a CV and give you advice on applications and interviews.
